SENATE Proposed Senate Resolution No. 1218



Introduced by Senator Aquilino "Koko" Pimentel III

A RESOLUTION

DIRECTING THE APPROPRIATE SENATE COMMITTEE TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY, IN AID OF LEGISLATION, ON THE PRESENT CIRCUMSTANCES OF THE CENTER FOR INTERNATIONAL TRADE EXPOSITIONS AND MISSIONS (CITEM), WITH THE END IN VIEW OF FORMULATING POLICIES FOR REFORMING IT

WHEREAS, the Center for International Trade Expositions and Missions (CITEM) is a government-owned or controlled corporation (GOCC);

WHEREAS, the CITEM has a mandate to develop, nurture, and promote micro, small and medium enterprises, brands, designers, and manufacturers by implementing an integrated approach to export marketing in partnership with other government and private entities. In short, CITEM is to promote Philippine products to the world;

WHEREAS, the CITEM is partially subsidized by the National Government through the General Appropriations Act. Its allocation is P195.6 Million in the 2024 GAA;

WHEREAS, as of the moment, the CITEM promotes Philippine products to only six countries (Germany, France, Japan, Malaysia,

UAE, and China) covering only two product sectors, namely Home and Fashion, and Processed Food;

WHEREAS, the CITEM seems to be encountering a lot of issues and challenges which prevent it from fully functioning and fulfilling its mandate as mentioned above;

WHEREAS, some of the well-known issues and challenges that CITEM is currently facing are the following, among others:

1. The high costs of exhibition spaces;

2. Other government agencies such as the Department of Agriculture, the Department of Science and Technology, the Department of Information and Communications Technology, and some agencies within the Department of Trade and Industry

conduct their own promotional events resulting to direct competition and duplication of functions;

 3. The present office building of the CITEM, the Golden Shell Pavilion, has been declared structurally precarious by the Department of Public Works and Highways and the CITEM was advised to move out at the soonest possible time;

WHEREAS, the CITEM is mandated to earn revenues to cover salaries, capital expenditures, and travels. The CITEM, as a partially subsidized government-owned or controlled corporation, has to pass on at least eighty percent (80%) of its cost to exhibitors in the form of participation fees in order to survive;

WHEREAS, the CITEM is the owner of a prime lot with an area of 4.9 hectares² from which it is **not** earning reasonable revenues which should and could have been used for its operations in fulfillment of its mandate;

WHEREAS, that said prime government lot has been leased under a long-term lease contract with the Philippine Exporters Confederation, Inc. (PHILEXPORT) for a very minimal rental amount of One Thousand Pesos (P1,000) per year. This long-term lease contract was entered into or authorized by then DTI Secretary Rizalino S. Navarro on January 23,

1996. It is for a period of fifty (50) years, renewable for another twenty-five (25) years at the option of the lessee PHILEXPORT;

WHEREAS, the undersigned has received a report that CITEM's lessee over this said prime government lot can charge at least fifteen million pesos (P15,000,000) for a 3-day exhibition in the premises. Under the long-term lease contract terms, this is an amount which CITEM can earn as the lessor for 15,000 years;

 WHEREAS, it is clear that CITEM needs to sort out its problems in order for it to be able to effectively pursue its mandate, including the way out of that long-term lease contract which is grossly disadvantageous to the Government;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED as it is hereby resolved, to direct the appropriate Senate committee to conduct an inquiry, in aid of legislation, on the present circumstances of the Center for International Trade Expositions and Missions (CITEM), with the end in view of formulating policies for reforming it.
