RESOLUTION

DIRECTING THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC INFORMATION AND MASS MEDIA TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY, IN AID OF LEGISLATION, ON THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE NEW SENATE BUILDING

Whereas, Section 1, Article XI of the 1987 Constitution states that: "Public office is a public trust. Public officers and employees must at all times be accountable to the people, serve them with utmost responsibility, integrity, loyalty, and efficiency, act with patriotism and justice, and lead modest lives";

Whereas, being part of one of the main branches of the government, it is incumbent upon the Senate to set the example of transparency and accountability not only to the entire bureaucracy but more importantly, to the Filipino people;

Whereas, by virtue of Senate Resolution No. 293 or 'Resolution Creating an Ad Hoc Committee Tasked to Conduct a Feasibility Study on the Construction of a New Senate Building and the Relocation of New Senate Building' and Adopted Resolution No. 110 or 'Resolution Confirming the Winner of the Global Conceptual Design Competition for the New Building of the Senate of the Philippines, the Senators of the 17th Congress approved the construction and relocation of the Senate building to Fort Bonifacio, Taguig;

Whereas, the Multi-Year Contractual Authority for Fiscal Years 2018, 2019, 2020, 2021, and 2022 was transferred by the Senate of the Philippines to the Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) in the capacity of the latter as the procuring entity, with a total amount of Eight Billion Nine Hundred Million Pesos (P8,900,000,000.00);

1 Whereas, on 22 January 2019, the bidding for the project was conducted, wherein the Notice of Award was later awarded in favor of Hilmarc's Construction 2 Corporation on 12 February 2019; 3 4 Whereas, on 10 June 2024, Senate President Francis Escudero announced that 5 he had ordered the new Chairman of the Senate Committee on Accounts, Senator 6 Alan Peter Cayetano, to review the cost of the New Senate Building (NSB), as it has 7 reportedly increased to P23 billion; 8 9 Whereas, subsequently, Senator Alan Peter Cayetano issued a statement that 10 he would ensure transparency in the review of the budget of the NSB "to ensure high 11 quality at a reduced cost"; 12 Whereas, in the public hearing conducted by the Committee on Accounts dated 13 03 July 2024, the Committee reported that the current total cost of the project is 14 15 P23.38 billion, of which P8.9 billion is for the core and shell; P2.5 billion is for the fitout; P1.6 billion for land acquisition; and P10.33 billion for works to complete; 16 17 Whereas, there is a need to let the public know of the partner contractors if any, and subcontractors of Hilmarc's Construction Corporation; 18 Whereas, informing the public of the processes undertaken in the construction 19 of the NSB including the increased costs, is necessary to ensure that the public does 20 21 not lose its trust in the Senate as an institution: Now, therefore, be it 22 RESOLVED, AS IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, to direct the Senate Committee on 23 Public Information and Mass Media to conduct an inquiry, in aid of legislation, on the 24 25 construction of the New Senate Building.
