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
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SENATE P.S. Res. No. 1069

RESOLUTION

DIRECTING THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC SERVICES TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY, IN AID OF LEGISLATION, ON THE LONG PASSENGER LINES IN INTERNATIONAL AND DOMESTIC AIRPORTS, AND TO REVIEW AND EVALUATE THE OPERATIONS OF THE MANILA INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT AUTHORITY

WHEREAS, recent reports and incidents have raised concerns regarding long passenger lines at the Ninoy Aquino International Airport (NAIA) and its operational efficiency, procedural transparency, and overall service quality, including passenger congestion, safety and security, and infrastructure deficiencies;

WHEREAS, as reported, many passengers have to endure long lines at checkin counters due to inefficient passenger airlines kiosks which have no sticker papers for printing of baggage tags;

WHEREAS, there are complaints that passengers also have to endure long lines at immigration counters due to alleged lack of immigration personnel or counters and prolonged immigration screenings;

WHEREAS, there are also alarming reports that airport e-gates scanners for arriving passengers often fail to read passports and boarding passes which forces passengers to queue for manual processing instead, which doubles the time spent at the counters;

WHEREAS, due to these delays, some tourists and passengers were unable to catch their flights including connecting flights;

WHEREAS, travelers are the ones carrying the burden of the inconvenience as they had to spend extra money to re-book their tickets and stay extra hours at the airports lobby, even when they are not the ones at fault;

WHEREAS, to add to the burden of the passengers, a number of escalators, walkalators, carousels, and tubes were either poorly operating or non-operational at all;

WHEREAS, there is also a need to address the lack of signages at the Arrival and Departure areas of the airport terminals, informing passengers of their rights in cases of missed flights due to immigration lines and other boarding problems;

WHEREAS, there is a necessity to evaluate the current situation and operational procedures of the Manila International Airport Authority to identify potential areas for improvement and ensure that international aviation standards are complied with;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, as it is hereby resolved, to direct the Senate Committee on Public Services to conduct an investigation, in aid of legislation, on the long passenger lines in international and domestic airports and on the operations of the Manila International Airport Authority (MIAA) to enable to recommend necessary reforms to modernize and optimize airport operations, meet global standards of excellence and enhance overall passenger experience.
