RESOLUTION CONCURRING IN THE FREE TRADE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF THE PHILIPPINES AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF KOREA

WHEREAS, Article VII, Section 21 of the Philippine Constitution states that,
"No treaty or international agreement shall be valid and effective unless concurred in
by at least two-thirds of all the Members of the Senate";

WHEREAS, The Free Trade Agreement between the Government of the Republic of the Philippines and the Government of the Republic of Korea ("Agreement") was signed on 7 September 2023 in Jakarta, Indonesia;

WHEREAS, the Agreement was concluded to manage competitive exclusion *vis-à-vis* Association of Southeast Asian Nations ("ASEAN") competitors, encourage more foreign direct investments, and secure more preferential concessions than those currently available to the Philippines under the ASEAN-Korea Free Trade Agreement ("FTA") and the Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement;

WHEREAS, the Philippines, through the Agreement, will expand its FTA network to encourage the entry of sustainable and high-quality investments, and to pursue forward-looking commitments on economic cooperation in priority areas such as industrial development, innovation, research and development, micro, small and medium-sized enterprises, and creative and cultural industries;
