- AN ACT SETTING THE TERM OF OFFICE OF BARANGAY OFFICIALS AND MEMBERS OF THE SANGGUNIANG KABATAAN, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1	SECTION 1. Term of Office. – The term of office of
2	all elected barangay and Sangguniang Kabataan officials
3	shall be four (4) years. No elective barangay official shall
4	serve for more than three (3) consecutive terms in the
5	same position. Voluntary renunciation of office for any
6	length of time shall not be considered as an interruption in

the continuity of service for the full term for which the
 elective official was elected.

3 SEC. 2. *Date of Election*. – The next regular barangay 4 and Sangguniang Kabataan elections shall be held on the 5 first Monday of October 2027 and every four (4) years 6 thereafter.

SEC. 3. Assumption of Office. – The term of office of
barangay officials and members of the Sangguniang
Kabataan elected subsequent to the effectivity of this Act
shall commence on the first day of November next
following their election.

Sec. 4. Hold-Over. - All incumbent barangay officials 12 and members of the Sangguniang Kabataan shall remain 13 14 in office unless sooner removed or suspended for cause 15 until their successors shall have been elected and gualified. SEC. 5. Transitory Provision. - Incumbent elective 16 17 barangay officials serving their third consecutive term in 18 the same position shall not be eligible to run for the same position in the October 2027 Barangay and Sangguniang 19 20 Kabataan Elections.

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1	SEC. 6. Implementing Rules and Regulations. –
2	Within ninety (90) days from the effectivity of this Act, the
3	Commission on Elections shall promulgate the necessary
4	rules and regulations for the implementation of this Act.
5	SEC. 7. Separability Clause If any portion or
6	provision of this Act is declared unconstitutional, the
7	remainder of this Act or any provision not affected thereby
8	shall remain in force and effect.
9	SEC. 8. Repealing Clause All laws, presidential
10	decrees, executive orders, administrative orders, and rules
11	and regulations inconsistent with this Act are hereby
12	repealed, modified, or amended accordingly.
13	SEC. 9. Effectivity Clause. – This Act shall take effect
14	upon publication in the Official Gazette or in a newspaper
15	of general circulation.
