"(S) POSTAL VOTING REFERS TO A MODE OF VOTING

WHERE MAILING PACKETS CONTAINING OFFICIAL BALLOTS

AND OTHER ELECTION PARAPHERNALIA ARE SENT TO THE

VOTERS THROUGH THE MAIL, OR ARE PERSONALLY

"(r) xxx

DELIVERED TO, OR PICKED-UP BY THE VOTERS AT THE POST OR SUCH OTHER VOTING AREAS DESIGNATED BY THE COMMISSION. THE VOTERS SHALL EITHER MAIL OR PERSONALLY DELIVER THEIR ACCOMPLISHED BALLOTS TO THE POST.

- "(T) ELECTRONIC VOTING REFERS TO A MODE OF VOTING THROUGH ELECTRONIC MEANS, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, ELECTRONIC MAIL, WEB-BASED PORTALS, AND OTHER INTERNET-BASED TECHNOLOGY, TO RECEIVE OFFICIAL BALLOTS FOR OVERSEAS VOTING, AND TO CAST VOTES THEREON.
- "(U) SEAFARER VOTING REFERS TO A MODE OF VOTING WHERE SEAFARERS, WHO ARE REGISTERED OVERSEAS VOTERS, MAY CAST THEIR BALLOTS DURING THE VOTING PERIOD THROUGH ELECTRONIC MEANS."
- SEC. 3. Section 6 of the same Act, as amended, is further amended to read as follows:
 - "SEC. 6. [*Personal*] Overseas Registration and/or Certification.

 Registration and/or certification as an overseas voter shall be done **EITHER** in person at any post abroad or at designated registration
 centers outside the post or in the Philippines approved by the

 Commission OR BY ELECTRONIC MEANS AS MAY BE **DETERMINED BY THE COMMISSION.**

"Field and mobile registration [centers] **ACTIVITIES** shall be set up by the posts concerned to ensure accessibility by the overseas voters.

"[All applicants shall submit themselves for live capture of their biometrics.] THE COMMISSION, THROUGH THE OFOV, SHALL COORDINATE WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS (DFA), DEPARTMENT OF MIGRANT WORKERS (DMW),

MARITIME INDUSTRY AUTHORITY (MARINA), PHILIPPINE STATISTICS AUTHORITY (PSA), COMMISSION ON FILIPINOS OVERSEAS (CFO), AND OTHER RELEVANT GOVERNMENT **AGENCIES TO OBTAIN BIOMETRICS OF OVERSEAS VOTERS:** PROVIDED, THAT THE BIOMETRICS DATA SHALL ONLY BE **USED FOR OVERSEAS VOTING REGISTRATION PURPOSES:** PROVIDED, FURTHER, THAT PROCESSING OF PERSONAL DATA SHALL COMPLY WITH THE PROVISIONS OF REPUBLIC ACT NO. 10173, OR "THE DATA PRIVACY ACT OF 2012", ITS IMPLEMENTING RULES AND REGULATIONS, AND OTHER RELATED **ISSUANCES** OF THE **NATIONAL PRIVACY** COMMISSION.

"The Commission shall issue an overseas voter identification card to those whose applications to vote, EITHER IN PERSON, BY MAIL, OR BY ELECTRONIC MEANS, AS MAY BE DETERMINED BY THE COMMISSION, have been approved."

SEC. 4. Section 10 of the same Act, as amended, is further amended to read as follows:

"SEC. 10. Transfer of Registration Record. – In the event of change of voting venue, an application for transfer of registration record must be filed **IN PERSON OR BY ELECTRONIC MEANS AS MAY BE DETERMINED BY THE COMMISSION**, by the overseas voter with the OFOV, through its Chairperson, at least one hundred eighty (180) days prior to the start of the overseas voting period: *Provided*, That those who would eventually vote in the Philippines should register within the time frame provided for local registration in the municipality, city or district where they intend to vote: *Provided*, *further*, That those who have registered in the municipality, city or district where they resided prior to their departure abroad need not register anew: *Provided*, *finally*, That transferees shall notify the OFOV, through its Chairperson, of their transfer back to the Philippines

1	at least one hundred eighty (180) days prior to the next national
2	elections for purposes of cancelling their names from the CLOV and of
3	removing their overseas voter's registration from the book of voters."
4	SEC. 5. Section 13 of the same Act, as amended, is further amended to read
5	as follows:
6	"SEC. 13. National Registry of Overseas Voters (NROV) The
7	Commission shall maintain a National Registry of Overseas Voters or
8	NROV containing the names of registered overseas voters and the
9	posts where they are registered. THE LIST SHALL BE PUBLISHED:

11	SAFEGUARD TO PROTECT THE DATA PRIVACY RIGHTS OF

14	SEC. 6. Section 23 of the same Act, as amended, is further amended to read
15	as follows:
16	"SEC. 23. Voting. – Voting may be done [either] personally, by
17	mail, or by ELECTRONIC OR any other means, as may be determined
18	by the Commission. For this purpose, the Commission shall issue the
19	necessary guidelines on the manner and procedure of voting.

22	SEC. 7. Section 25 of the same Act, as amended, is further amended to read
23	as follows:
24	"SEC. 25. Voting by mail. –
25	25.1. [For the May, 2004 elections, t]The Commission shall
26	authorize voting by mail [in not more than three (3) countries, subject
27	to the approval of the Congressional Oversight Committee]. Voting
28	by mail may be allowed in countries that satisfy the following

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16	"SEC. 8. Sections 25-A and 25-B are hereby inserted as new sections to read
17	as follows:
18	"SEC. 25-A. <i>VOTING BY ELECTRONIC MEANS.</i> —
19	"25-A.1. FOR THE 2025 NATIONAL ELECTIONS AND
20	SUCCEEDING ELECTIONS OVERSEAS, THE COMMISSION
21	MAY AUTHORIZE VOTING BY ELECTRONIC MEANS THROUGH
22	THE USE OF THE INTERNET IN ALL COUNTRIES THAT ALLOW
23	INTERNET VOTING WITHIN THE JURISDICTIONS OF THE
24	POSTS. INTERNET VOTING MAY BE ALLOWED IN COUNTRIES
25	WITH STABLE INTERNET CONNECTION. THE SYSTEM OR
26	APPLICATION TO BE USED FOR INTERNET VOTING MUST:
27	"(A) UNDERGO RIGOROUS TESTING AND REQUIRED
28	CERTIFICATIONS, AS DETERMINED BY THE COMMISSION;

"(B) HAVE STRINGENT SECURITY FEATURES BASED ON INDUSTRY STANDARDS AT THE TIME OF USE, AS DETERMINED BY THE COMMISSION, TO ENSURE THE SANCTITY OF THE VOTE AS WELL AS THE VOTER'S INFORMATION, INTEGRITY OF THE ELECTRONIC BALLOTS, AND TRANSPARENCY OF THE ELECTORAL PROCESS.

"25-A.2. ALL OVERSEAS VOTERS UNDER THE POSTS ADOPTING INTERNET VOTING SHALL BE ENTITLED TO CAST THEIR DIGITAL BALLOTS AT ANY TIME WITHIN THE COMMISSION'S IDENTIFIED VOTING PERIOD USING INTERNET-ENABLED DEVICE/S, SUBJECT TO COMPLIANCE WITH THE RULES AND/OR GUIDELINES TO BE ISSUED BY THE COMMISSION.

"25-A.3. ONLY BALLOTS TRANSMITTED THROUGH ELECTRONIC MEANS AND RECEIVED BY THE SYSTEM BEFORE THE CLOSE OF VOTING ON THE DAY OF ELECTIONS SHALL BE COUNTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THIS ACT.

"25-A.4. THE COMMISSION SHALL ISSUE GUIDELINES PERTAINING TO THE CONDUCT OF INTERNET VOTING, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO, THE PERIOD FOR PRE-VOTING ENROLLMENT, VERIFICATION/ VALIDATION PROCEDURES, VOTING PROCEDURES, AND OTHER RULES NECESSARY AND SUFFICIENT TO FACILITATE THE VOTING PROCESS.

"SEC. 25-B. *VOTING BY SEAFARERS*. – SEAFARERS SITUATED OVERSEAS AT THE TIME OF THE ELECTIONS MAY VOTE BY ELECTRONIC MEANS, AS MAY BE DETERMINED BY THE COMMISSION.

"THE COMMISSION SHALL ADOPT GUIDELINES ON VOTING PROCEDURES FOR SEAFARERS AND OTHER SEA-BASED OVERSEAS FILIPINO WORKERS AND SECURE THEIR

RIGHT TO VOTE, WITHOUT REQUIRING THEM TO GO TO THE DESIGNATED VOTING CENTER FROM THE NEAREST PORT."

SEC. 9. Section 32 of the same Act, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

"SEC. 32. *Information Campaign.* – The Commission, in coordination with agencies concerned, shall undertake an information campaign to educate the public on the manner of overseas voting for qualified overseas voters. It may require the support and assistance of the DFA, through the posts, the DOLE, the Department of [Transportation and Communications (DOTC)] INFORMATION AND COMMUNICATIONS TECHNOLOGY (DICT), THE DMW, THE NATIONAL PRIVACY COMMISSION (NPC), the Philippine Portal Corporation (PPC), [the POEA,] the OWWA, THE MARINA, and the Commission on Filipinos Overseas.

xxx."

SEC. 10. Section 34 of the same Act, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

"SEC. 34. Assistance from Government Agencies. – All government officers, particularly from the DFA, the DOLE, the [DOTC], THE DMW, THE DICT, THE NPC, the PPC, [the POEA,] the OWWA, the Commission on Filipinos Overseas, THE MARINA, and other government offices concerned with the welfare of the Filipinos overseas shall, to the extent compatible with the primary responsibilities, assist the Commission in carrying out the provisions of this Act. All such agencies or officers thereof shall take reasonable measures to expedite all election activities, which the Commission shall require of them. When necessary, the Commission may send supervisory teams headed by career officers to assist the posts.

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SEC. 11. Section 36 of the same Act, as amended, is further amended to read as follows:

1 "SEC. 36. *Prohibited Acts.* – In addition to the prohibited acts provided by law, it shall be unlawful: 2 "36.1. xxx; 3 "36.2. xxx; 4 5 "36.3. xxx; "36.4. xxx: 6 "36.5. xxx: 7 "36.6. xxx: 8 "36.7. xxx; 9 10 "36.8. Section 37 of the same Act, as amended, is further amended to read 19 as follows: 20 "SEC. 37. Joint Congressional Oversight Committee. — A Joint 21

"SEC. 37. Joint Congressional Oversight Committee. — A Joint Congressional Oversight Committee is hereby created, composed of the Chairperson of the Senate Committee on [Constitutional Amendments, Revision of Codes and Laws] ELECTORAL REFORMS AND PEOPLE'S PARTICIPATION, and seven (7) other Senators designated by the Senate President, and the Chairperson of the House Committee on Suffrage and Electoral Reforms, and seven (7) other Members of the House of Representatives designated by the Speaker of the House of Representatives: Provided, That, of the seven (7) members to be designated by each House of Congress, four (4) should come from the majority to include the chair of the COMMITTEE ON FOREIGN RELATIONS FOR THE SENATE AND

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1	THE CHAIR OF THE Committee on Foreign Affairs FOR THE
2	HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, and the remaining three (3) from
3	the minority.

5	SEC. 13. Section 41 of the same Act, as amended, is further amended to read
6	as follows:
7	"SEC. 41. Appropriations. – The amount necessary to carry out
8	the provisions of this Act shall be included in the budgets of the
9	Commission on Elections, [and] the DFA, THE DMW, THE DOLE,
10	THE DICT, THE PPC, MARINA, CFO, AND THE OWWA in the
11	annual General Appropriations Act."
12	SEC.14. Implementing Rules and Regulations. – The Commission on Elections,
13	in consultation with the DFA, the DMW, the DOLE, the DICT, the CFOR, MARINA,
14	OWWA, and other relevant government agencies, civil society organizations, and
15	accredited Filipino community organizations or associations abroad, shall promulgate
16	rules and regulations for the implementation and enforcement of the provisions of this
17	Act within sixty (60) days from the effectivity thereof.
18	SEC. 15. Separability Clause. – If any portion or provision of this Act is declared
19	unconstitutional, the remainder of this Act not affected thereby shall remain in force
20	and effect.
21	SEC. 16. Repealing Clause All laws, presidential decrees, executive orders,
22	administrative orders, and rules and regulations inconsistent with this Act are hereby
23	repealed, modified, or amended accordingly.
24	SEC. 17. Effectivity This Act shall take effect upon publication in the Official
25	Gazette or in a newspaper of general circulation.
