AN ACT

CONSOLIDATING ALL PERFORMANCE MEASUREMENT TOOLS REWARDS **SYSTEMS** FOR ALL LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNITS BY **INSTITUTIONALIZING** Α CULTURE OF MERITOCRACY IN THE PHILIPPINES, AMENDING CERTAIN PROVISIONS OF REPUBLIC ACT NO. 11292, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS "THE SEAL OF GOOD LOCAL GOVERNANCE ACT OF 2019" AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

EXPLANATORY NOTE

The efforts to promote transparency, accountability and efficiency in the local government units and to reward those who excel in espousing these principles has unceasingly been pursued by the leaders of our nation. One of these commendable efforts is the "Seal of Good Housekeeping" (SGH) and the "Performance Challenge Fund" which were rolled out in 2010 by the Department of the Interior and Local Government. SGH evolved into the Seal of Good Local Government Partnership Commitment. Eventually, SGLG was institutionalized through legislation with the passage of Republic Act No. 11292, otherwise known as "The Seal of Good Local Governance Act of 2019".

For years now, SGLG has been both a challenge and an inspiration for LGUs to improve their services their constituents, initiate worthwhile programs and projects, and responsibly manage their financial resources. It showcases best

practices and remarkable innovations of LGUs which, in turn, serve as models to other LGUs as well as international entities.

The "*Local Governance Meritocracy Act*" seeks to amend Republic Act 11292 to expand the criteria of SGLG and increase the funding for its facilitation and operations. It proposes to expand the criteria to include human development meritocracy criteria which focuses on gauging development outcomes such as health, education, standard of living, peace and order. Through these, SGLG will be more holistic and reflective of the good governance that it continues to uphold.

In view of the foregoing, the immediate passage of this bill is highly recommended.

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Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

Section 1. Short Title. – This Act shall be known as the "Local Governance
 Meritocracy Act".

3 Sec. 2. Section 2 of Republic Act No. 11292 is hereby amended to read as 4 follows:

PROCESSING STANDARDS FOR THIS MEASURE AND 1 SUPPORT THE LGUS BY PROVIDING ANY DATA THEY NEED 2 TO REGULARLY UPDATE THEIR DIMENSIONS UNDER THE 3 HUMAN DEVELOPMENT MERITOCRACY CRITERIA: Provided, 4 That the Council shall designate each Council member to lead the 5 development of performance indicators in his/her area of jurisdiction 6 7 or expertise and recommend the approval of such performance indicators by the Council: Provided, further, That in the 8 development and approval of the performance indicators, the 9 Council shall take into consideration that LGUs may not be similarly 10 situated and that one (1) or more indicators may be peculiarly 11 inapplicable or extremely difficult to meet given the inherent 12 13 limitations or circumstances of the LGUs: **PROVIDED**, **FINALLY**, THAT THE COUNCIL SHALL TAKE INTO CONSIDERATION 14 THE INDIVIDUAL PERFORMANCE OF EACH LEVEL OF LGU 15 **VIS-À-VIS** THEIR **OWN** RESPECTIVE **HISTORICAL** 16 PERFORMANCES 17 BASED ON THE **STANDARDS** FOR EVALUATING EACH DIMENSION UNDER THE HUMAN 18 DEVELOPMENT MERITOCRACY CRITERIA AS DEFINED 19 **UNDER SECTION 7 OF THIS ACT.** 20

8 Sec. 5. Section 6 of Republic Act No. 11292 is hereby amended to read as 9 follows:

10 "Sec. 6. Implementing [Agency] AGENCIES. - The DILG **AND THE PSA** shall be the **JOINT** implementing [agency] 11 AGENCIES of this Act. [It] THEY shall, through [it's] THEIR 12 relevant bureaus and offices, and in consultation and coordination 13 with their partner agencies or sectors, THE RESPECTIVE 14 **LEAGUES OF LGUS AND CONCERNED LGUS,** be responsible for 15 the assessment and evaluation of each LGU relative to its 16 compliance with the criteria, and **SHALL** recommend to the Council 17 18 whether an LGU qualifies to be conferred or awarded the SGLG OR OTHER APPROPRIATE ACTION AS MAY BE ALLOWED IN 19 THIS ACT. 20

21 "The DILG AND/OR THE PSA shall call on any other

3 Sec. 6. Section 7 of Republic Act No. 11292 is hereby amended to read as 4 follows:

"Sec. 7. Criteria. – For the purpose of this Act, THERE WILL 5 TWO CRITERIA CATEGORIES: (I) GOVERNANCE BE 6 **CRITERIA, WHICH FOCUSES ON PROCESSES AND INPUTS** 7 FOR STRENGTHENING LOCAL GOVERNANCE AND, (II) 8 HUMAN DEVELOPMENT MERITOCRACY CRITERIA, WHICH 9 FOCUSES ON GAUGING DEVELOPMENT OUTCOMES THAT AN 10 LGU IS EXPECTED TO ACHIEVE.  25 CONSTITUENTS.

26 "(C) STANDARD OF LIVING – THIS DIMENSION
 27 MEASURES THE LEVEL OF INCOME OF CONSTITUENTS AND
 28 ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITIES WITHIN A LOCALITY.

29 "(D) PEACE AND ORDER & PUBLIC SAFETY – THIS
 30 DIMENSION MEASURES THE PREVALENCE OF CRIME
 31 WITHIN A LOCALITY.

"EACH DIMENSION UNDER THE HUMAN 1 DEVELOPMENT MERITOCRACY CRITERIA 2 SHALL BE **MEASURED USING A SET OF INDICATORS FORMULATED** 3 COUNCIL DETERMINED BY THE AND BASED ON 4 ACCEPTABLE STANDARDS USED NATIONALLY OR 5 INTERNATIONALLY, TOGETHER WITH THE DATA IN THE 6 7 PHILIPPINE HUMAN DEVELOPMENT REPORT. THE COUNCIL SHALL PRIORITIZE INDICATORS THAT MAY BE 8 **RETRIEVED FROM NATIONAL GOVERNMENT AND LOCAL** 9 GOVERNMENT SOURCES WITHOUT THE NEED FOR 10 PRIMARY DATA GATHERING METHODOLOGIES SUCH AS 11 12 STATISTICAL SURVEYS, CENSUS AND REGISTERS. THE SET **OF INDICATORS FOR EACH DIMENSION SHALL BE USED TO** 13 COMPUTE FOR THE QUALIFICATIONS OF EACH LGU AND 14 ASSESSED BASED ON THEIR RESPECTIVE HISTORICAL 15 **GROWTH OR PERFORMANCE SO THAT EACH LEVEL OF LGU** 16 COMPETES AGAINST ITSELF AND NOT AS AGAINST OTHER 17 LGUS. 18

"THE COUNCIL SHALL CONTINUOUSLY EXPLORE 19 **ALTERNATIVE STATISTICAL INDICATORS FOR THE HUMAN** 20 DEVELOPMENT MERITOCRACY CRITERIA, AS MAY BE 21 **NECESSARY AND APPROPRIATE FOR PURPOSES OF FASTER** 22 DATA COLLECTION AND PROCESSING. THESE INDICATORS 23 SHALL BE UPDATED ANNUALLY BY THE COUNCIL AND 24 SHARED WITH THE CONCERNED LGUS TO ENSURE THAT 25 THE DATA EFFECTIVELY REFLECTS THE KEY DIMENSIONS 26 OF THE HUMAN DEVELOPMENT MERITOCRACY CRITERIA. 27

Sec. 7. Two (2) new sections denominated as Section 7-A and Section 7-B, respectively, are inserted after Section 7 of Republic Act No. 11292 and shall read as follows:

"SEC. 7-A. DATA COLLECTION. - LGUS MAY BE 1 DESIGNATED AS THE PRIMARY DATA COLLECTOR WITHIN 2 THEIR RESPECTIVE LOCALITIES. FOR THIS PURPOSES, 3 LGUS MAY OPT TO HIRE THE NECESSARY PERSONNEL. THE 4 NUMBER AND POSITIONS OF WHICH SHALL RF 5 DETERMINED BY THE COUNCIL THROUGH THE REVISED 6 **IMPLEMENTING RULES AND REGULATIONS (RIRR) TO BE** 7 **ISSUED THEREFOR.** 8

9 "CONSISTENT WITH SECTION 7 OF THIS ACT, DATA
 10 THAT MAY BE ACCESSED WITHOUT THE NEED FOR
 11 PRIMARY DATA GATHERING METHODOLOGIES AS
 12 DESCRIBED ABOVE SHALL BE PRIORITIZED.

"SEC. 7-B. FREOUENCY OF DATA COLLECTION. - FOR 13 THE HUMAN DEVELOPMENT MERITOCRACY CRITERIA 14 UNDER SECTION 7 OF THIS ACT, REGULAR AND 15 SYNCHRONIZED DATA COLLECTION SHALL BE CONDUCTED 16 BY LGUS ANNUALLY OR ON SHORTER PERIODS BASED ON 17 THE LATEST AVALABILITY OF IDENTIFIED INDICATORS. IN 18 THE CONDUCT OF DATA COLLECTION, LGUS SHALL RECEIVE 19 TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE FROM THE APPROPRIATE 20 AGENCIES, AS NEEDED. NATIONAL GOVERNMENT 21 COROLLARY TO THEIR DATA COLLECTIONS, LGUS SHALL, 22 TO THE EXTENT POSSIBLE, MONITOR THE HUMAN 23 **DEVELOPMENT MERITOCRACY INDICATORS.** 24

25 Sec. 8. Section 8 of Republic Act No. 11292 is hereby amended to read as 26 follows:

27 "Sec. 8. *Requisites to Qualify for SGLG.* – An LGU, which,
 according to the assessment of the DILG, complies, qualifies, and
 passes all assessment criteria as provided in Section 7 of this Act,
 AND APPROVED BY THE COUNCIL, shall be conferred and
 awarded the SGLG and granted the corresponding **RECOGNITION**,
 AWARDS AND MONETARY incentive as provided under Section

11 of this Act. IN ASSESSING AN LGU'S QUALIFICATION FOR
 THE SGLG, GREATER CONSIDERATION SHALL BE GIVEN TO
 THE COMPLIANCE WITH THE HUMAN DEVELOPMENT
 MERITOCRACY CRITERIA, SUBJECT TO GUIDELINES TO BE
 ISSUED BY THE COUNCIL."

6 Sec. 9. Section 11 of Republic Act No. 11292 is hereby amended to read as 7 follows:

"Sec. 11. The SGLG Incentive Fund. – x x x

"LGUS 13 EXPERIENCING PERSISTENT AND UNJUSTIFIABLE DECLINES IN THE INDICATORS TO BE 14 **IDENTIFIED** UNDER THE HUMAN DEVELOPMENT 15 MERITOCRACY CRITERIA MAY BE DISINCENTIVISED: 16 **PROVIDED, THAT EXTERNAL SHOCKS, SUCH AS NATURAL** 17 CALAMITIES, PANDEMICS, OR UNFORESEEABLE EVENTS 18 BEYOND THE CONTROL OF THE LGUS SHALL BE 19 **CONSIDERED AS JUSTIFIABLE CAUSES."** 20

21 Sec. 10. Section 12 of Republic Act No. 11292 is hereby amended to read as 22 follows:

"Sec. 12. Utilization and Limitations on Expenditures of the
 Incentives under the SGLG Fund. – The use if the incentives paid
 out of the SGLG Fund shall be governed by the policies governing
 the utilization of the twenty percent (20%) of the annual [Internal
 Revenue Allotment (IRA)] NATIONAL TAX ALLOTMENT (NTA)
 for local development projects, the Annual Investment Program
 (AIP) and the Local Development Investment Program (LDIP).

30 "The **MONETARY** incentives paid out of the SGLG Fund shall
31 not be used for any of the following:

Sec. 11. Section 14 of Republic Act No. 11292 is hereby amended to read as
follows:

Sec. 14. *Management and Administration of the SGLG Fund.*The SGLG Fund established under Section 11 of this Act shall be
managed and administered by the DILG with the supervision of the
Council. Appropriation to replenish the amount paid out from the
Fund during the year and/or to augment the Fund shall be proposed
by and **ANNUALLY** included in the budget of the DILG under the
GAA."

Sec. 12. Section 15 of Republic Act No. 11292 is hereby amended to read as
 follows:

"Sec. 15. Guarantee of Local Government Autonomy. - The 13 LOCAL autonomy AND FISCAL DECENTRALIZATION of LGUs 14 shall be respected at all times. Nothing in this Act shall be 15 interpreted as limiting the autonomy of LGUs to establish policies 16 17 and pursue programs and projects designed not only to qualify for 18 the SGLG award but also to ensure the enjoyment of their constituency the right to life, liberty, property, health, education, 19 20 balanced and healthful ecology, among others, in the exercise of their **POLICE** power under the general welfare clause." 21

22 Sec. 13. Section 16 of Republic Act No. 11292 is hereby amended to read as 23 follows:

²⁴ "Sec. 16. *SGLG Operating Fund.* – The activities and
²⁵ operational expenses, other than the incentive payouts, related to
²⁶ the implementation of this Act shall be initially funded from the
²⁷ DILG's Performance Challenge Fund. Thereafter, the DILG shall
²⁸ include in its annual budget to be incorporated in the GAA, the item
²⁹ for the SGLG operating fund in the amount equivalent to **NOT LESS**³⁰ **THAN [two] FIVE** percent [2%] (5%) of the SGLG Fund.

Sec. 14. *Data Privacy.* – This data collection system shall respect the fundamental human right of privacy, ensure data quality, and uphold data protection principles of legitimate purpose, transparency, and proportionality.

Sec. 15. *Implementing Rules and Regulations.* – Within ninety (90) days from the effectivity of this Act, the members of the Council led by the DILG and the PSA, in coordination with the Union of Local Authorities of the Philippines (ULAP) and the Leagues of LGUs and local officials, shall promulgate the implementing rules and regulations necessary for the effective implementation of this Act.

9 Sec. 16. *Separability Clause.* – If any provision or part hereof is held invalid 10 or unconstitutional, the remainder of the law or the provision or part not otherwise 11 affected shall remain valid and subsisting.

Sec. 17. *Repealing Clause.* – Any law, presidential decree or issuance, executive order, letter of instruction, administrative order, rule, or regulation contrary to or inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed, modified, or amended accordingly.

16 Sec. 18. *Effectivity.* – This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its 17 publication in the *Official Gazette* or in a newspaper of general circulation.
