PRESCRIBING SCHOOL BUS SAFETY STANDARDS AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

EXPLANATORY NOTE

In a country where road congestion has become a daily struggle, according to the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA), there has been a significant increase in road traffic accidents, injuries, and deaths over the past few years. The lack of regulated safety standards for school buses and drivers exposes students to unnecessary risks, jeopardizing their well-being.

This measure addresses these challenges by mandating stricter safety protocols, such as driver training and the mandatory installation of seat belts, ensuring that school transportation is secure and reliable. It also seeks to institutionalize safety as a non-negotiable component of school bus operations and emphasizes compliance with modern vehicle safety standards and introduces accountability for transport providers, prioritizing child welfare and aligning with global standards on road safety.

The bill not only seeks to protect students from unsafe school bus, but also aims to foster public trust in school transportation services, ensuring that parents and guardians can entrust their children's safety without hesitation. This initiative reflects the government's unwavering commitment in creating safer educational environments and promoting sustainable development. The safety and security of our students are not just priorities but are foundational to our national progress. By ensuring that our students are protected during their daily commute, we are investing in the future of our nation. Safe and secure educational environments foster better learning conditions, which in turn produce well-rounded and educated citizens who will drive our country's development forward.

In this light, the immediate passage of this bill is highly recommended.

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Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

Section 1. Short Title- This Act shall be known as the "School Bus Safety Act". 1 Sec. 2. Declaration of Policy - It is hereby declared the policy of the State to 2 3 promote safety in order to protect passengers of school buses from injury in case of accidents. 4 Sec. 3. Definition of Terms- For purposes of this Act the terms: 5 a) *Bus* means a motor vehicle, except a trailer, designed for carrying more than 6 7 ten (10) persons; b) School Bus means a bus that is used for purposes that include carrying 8 students to and from public or private school or school-related events on a 9 regular basis, but does not include a transit bus or a school-chartered bus; 10 c) School-Chartered Bus means a bus that is operated under a short-term 11 contract with the school authorities who have acquired exclusive use of the 12 bus at a fixed charge in order to provide transportation for a group of pupils 13 to a special school related event; and 14 d) Seats Belts refer to the combined lap belt and shoulder strap that fasten a 15 rider to moving vehicle and prevent the rider from being thrown out or against 16 the interior of the vehicle during sudden stops. 17

- 1 Sec. 4. Proficiency Standards for School Bus Drivers. -
- a) Requirement- Not later than one (1) year after the date of enactment of this
 Act, the Department of Transportation shall prescribe proficiency standards for
 school bus drivers who are required to possess a professional license to operate
 a school bus.

b) Demonstration of Proficiency- Upon the prescription of standards under 6 7 subsection (a), each school bus driver referred to in subsection (a) shall demonstrate (at such interval as the Department of Transportation shall 8 prescribe) to the employer of the driver, the school, the licensing agency, or 9 10 other person or agency responsible for regulating school bus drivers the proficiency of such driver in operating a school bus in accordance with the 11 12 proficiency standards prescribed under subsection (a) or the proficiency standards established by the State concerned, as the case may be. 13

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Sec. 5. Seat Belts in School Buses. -

15 a) Requirement for Installation- Not later than one (1) year after the date of the 16 enactment of this Act, the Department of Transportation shall prescribe regulations requiring driver seat belts and passenger seat belts (including lap safety belts or other 17 child safety devices meeting applicable government safety standards) for each seating 18 19 position in any newly manufactured school bus. Owners of school buses which are not 20 currently equipped with seat belts shall be given a period of six (6) months from the publication of the regulations of this Act to install the necessary seat belts in their 21 22 school buses,

23 b) Promotion of Seat Belt Usage-

1) In General- The Department of Transportation, in consultation with appropriate safety organizations and parent-teacher organizations, shall conduct a program to promote and encourage the use of seat belts in school buses.

27 2) Elements of Program- In conducting the program required under this28 subsection, the Department of Transportation shall:

i. Encourage the local governments to monitor the mandatory usage of
 seat belts in school buses;

ii. Develop and disseminate educational materials on the importance of
 using seat belts to passengers and drivers of school buses; and

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iii. Recognize schools that achieve a high level of seat beit usage by
 passengers and drivers of school buses.

Sec. 6. *Registration -* No school bus shall be allowed to be registered unless it is
equipped with the necessary seat belts.

5 Sec. 7. *Implementing Authority* - The Department of Transportation shall be 6 primarily responsible for the enforcement of the provisions of this Act. For this 7 purpose, the Department of Transportation, in consultation with relevant government 8 agencies and private citizens organizations and stakeholders, shail issue within ninety 9 (90) days from the effectivity of this Act the relevant implementing rules and 10 regulations.

Sec. 8. *Separability Clause.* – If any part, section or provision of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional, the sections or provisions which are not affected shall remain valid and subsisting.

Sec. 9. *Repealing Clause.* – All laws, decrees, executive orders, ordinances, rules, regulations, other issuances or parts thereof, which are inconsistent with this Act, are hereby repealed or amended accordingly.

Sec. 10. *Effectivity*. – This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its
 complete publication in the *Official Gazette* or in a newspaper of general circulation.
