RESOLUTION

DIRECTING THE APPROPRIATE SENATE COMMITTEE TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY, IN AID OF LEGISLATION, ON THE ALLEGED UNAUTHORIZED OFF-CAMPUS ACTIVITY OF BESTLINK COLLEGE EXPOSED ITS STUDENTS TO SEVERE LOGISTICAL PROBLEMS AND SAFETY CONCERNS WITH THE END IN VIEW OF IDENTIFYING THE GAPS IN THE COMMISSION ON HIGHER EDUCATION'S POLICIES IN RELATION TO SCHOOLS' OFF-CAMPUS ACTIVITIES

WHEREAS, viral videos on social media showed that approximately 1,000 1 students of Bestlink College of the Philippines (hereinafter referred to as Bestlink) were 2 left stranded and forced to walk for hours along highways on the evening of January 3 26, 2025 after attending the school's 23rd founding anniversary celebration at Punta 4 Belle, Hermosa, Bataan; 5 WHEREAS, in the midst of this ordeal, there were students who passed out due 6 to hunger, fatigue and other health issues, thus, were carried by ambulance; 7 WHEREAS, said incident exposed the students to severe logistical problems and 8 9 safety concerns; WHEREAS, students who went to the Wanted sa Radyo Program aired that 10 Bestlink mandated its more than 27,000 students to join the said out-of-town activity 11 and threatened that the non-participating students will face the pain of possibly failing 12 some of their subjects; 13

WHEREAS, the imposition of punitive measures upon the students who failed
to attend/join the activity is in violation of Commission on Higher Education (CHED
Memorandum No. 63, s. 2017;
WUEDEAS Postlink denied the aforesaid allocations and stated that details

WHEREAS, Bestlink denied the aforesaid allegations and stated that details publicized during the event were misinformation intended to damage its reputation;

WHEREAS, Bestlink was previously involved in another unfortunate fatal offcampus activity in February 2017 wherein13 of its students, a teacher and a bus driver died and 40 were injured;

WHEREAS, as a consequence, CHED did not impose any sanction aside from prohibiting Bestlink from conducting any off-campus activity;

WHEREAS, the Commission on Higher Education (CHED) issued a show cause order against Bestlink over its unauthorized off-campus activity, emphasizing that the school made no submissions of required documents with CHED Regional Office National Capital Region;

WHEREAS, CHED is mandated to establish and implement guidelines of curricular and non-curricular off-campus activities of colleges and universities;

WHEREAS, there is a policy gap on regulating schools' off campus activities, specifically on paper requirement submissions and risk assessments to ensure students' safety during off-campus activities;

WHEREAS, it is important to probe this incident to bolster student safety and welfare across all educational institutions;

RESOLVED BY THE SENATE, as it is hereby resolved, To conduct an inquiry in aid of legislation, to conduct an inquiry, in aid of legislation, on the alleged unauthorized off-campus activity of Bestlink College exposed its students to severe logistical problems and safety concerns with the end in view of identifying the gaps in the CHED's policies in relation to schools' off-campus activities.
